1 INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to the provisions of Articles 12 and 13 of the Law on Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina (“Official Gazette of BiH”, Nos. 26/04 and 42/04), the Agency for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina (hereinafter: the Agency), after conducting consultations with the entity statistical institutes (Institute for Statistics of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Republika Srpska Institute of Statistics), prepares the Draft Statistical Programme of Bosnia and Herzegovina (hereinafter: the Statistical Programme).

In accordance with the provisions of Article 13, paragraphs (3) and (4) of the Law on Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Agency submits the proposal of the Statistical Programme, together with the comments and/or opinions of the Council for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina, to the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina for adoption. The proposal of the Statistical Programme shall be considered final after the expiry of a period of three (3) months from its presentation to the Council of Ministers, and the Council of Ministers may amend it.

In preparing the Statistical Programme, the Agency shall also conduct consultations with the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the Ministry for Human Rights and Refugees, and the Directorate for European Integration, which, within their respective competences, perform statistical tasks or monitor the compliance of the statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina with European requirements (regulations and standards).

The starting point for the preparation of the draft Statistical Programme consists of the general objectives and directions of implementation set out in the document *Strategic Directions for the Development of Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina 2030*. The Statistical Programme defines statistical activities that will ensure, during the specified period, the harmonisation of statistical surveys and indicators with the standards of the European Statistical System and with the needs of users specified in the document *Statistical Requirements Compendium 2024 (edition 2024)*. The elaboration of activities within the Statistical Programme is structured according to statistical areas, in line with the international classification of statistical activities.

The Statistical Programme is largely determined by the role of official statistics in the European integration process: first, official statistics constitute a distinct chapter in the negotiation process, and second, official statistics data will be used to monitor the implementation of sectoral and other policies, which requires accelerating the harmonisation of the statistical system of Bosnia and Herzegovina with the statistics of European Union countries. The Statistical Programme covers priority areas, the activities to be undertaken during the relevant period, an overview of the development objectives of official statistics by statistical area, the expected results to be produced and disseminated, the responsible producers of official statistics for each statistical domain, and the primary purpose of the statistical data.

Terms that are presented in a single grammatical gender in this Statistical Programme refer equally to both men and women, without discrimination.

2 FRAMEWORK OF THE STATISTICAL SYSTEM OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

2.1 Legal framework of operation

The legal framework for the organisation of statistical data, as well as for all activities related to the preparation, collection, processing, analysis, and dissemination of statistical data for Bosnia and Herzegovina, is provided by the Law on Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina ("Official Gazette of BiH", Nos. 26/04, 42/04).

Furthermore, in order to regulate mutual relations and improve the functioning of a unified professional statistical structure in Bosnia and Herzegovina - between the Agency for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the entity statistical institutes - the „Agreement on the Application of Unified Methodologies and Unified Standards in the Production of Statistical Data of Bosnia and Herzegovina “(2005) was concluded. This document specifies that the Statistical Programme, or the annual Work Plan, determines the priority statistical activities of interest to Bosnia and Herzegovina, their implementation plan, as well as the method of financing.

In addition, the Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina follow professional standards established by the European Statistics Code of Practice, the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, and the Public Commitment of the European System of Central Banks on European Statistics.

To meet these requirements, close cooperation between the Agency and the entity statistical institutions is essential, along with continuous interaction with users, in accordance with the general principles of quality management, including leadership commitment, partnership, employee satisfaction, and the continuous improvement and development of harmonised European statistics.

2.2 Organizational framework of operation

The statistical system of Bosnia and Herzegovina is characterized by functional centralization and regional decentralization, reflecting the administrative structure of the country.

The producers of official statistics in Bosnia and Herzegovina are: at the state level - the Agency for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina (the Agency); at the entity level - Institute for Statistics of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (FIS) and the Republika Srpska Institute of Statistics (RSIS). The Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina (CBBIH) is the official producer of statistics at the state level, responsible for monetary, balance of payments, and financial statistics. The activities of the CBBIH as a producer of these statistics are regulated by the Law on the Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

At the state level, the Agency and the CBBIH are the sole official producers of statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina. In addition to producing entity-level statistics, the entity statistical institutes also act as producers of the Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as they provide the Agency with the data necessary for implementing the Statistical Programme.

Producers of official statistics carry out their work with professional independence, impartiality towards all users, objectivity, and reliability, while respecting the principles of statistical confidentiality and cost-effectiveness.

The development, production, and dissemination of statistical data are based on prescribed methodologies, best international standards, and transparently documented procedures according to quality criteria: relevance, accuracy, timeliness, adherence to publication deadlines, coherence, comparability, accessibility, and clarity of data.

The Council for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina was established by the *Law on Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina* as an advisory body. The Council provides opinions on the preparation and implementation of the Statistical Programme, as well as on the functioning and further development of statistics.

2.3 International cooperation and European integration

The process of harmonizing standards to obtain comparable indicators, as well as the inclusion of all responsible producers of official statistics in international statistical cooperation, should be accompanied by: the implementation of international projects aimed, within the framework of international assistance, at improving the Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina; bilateral cooperation with other national statistical institutions; and active participation in international statistical working groups with the aim of enhancing and promoting our official statistics. In the period 2025–2028, the continuation of work on ongoing and new projects is expected.

3 MISSION, VISION

3.1 Mission

Our mission is to prepare and disseminate credible, reliable, timely, and high-quality official statistics necessary for decision-making and for informing the public on matters of significance for Bosnia and Herzegovina.

3.2 Vision

By strengthening professional and infrastructural capacities and adopting and applying best statistical practices, the Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina will achieve full compliance with international statistical standards and principles.

4 STATISTICAL PROGRAMME OF BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA 2025 – 2028

The Statistical Programme is prepared by the Agency in consultation with the entity statistical institutes and the CBBIH.

The Agency establishes statistical standards for the implementation of the Statistical Programme, which are used by all producers of the Statistics of BiH. The production of the Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina is based on data provided by the entity statistical institutes, the CBBIH, and data collected by the Agency from administrative sources.

4.1 Coordination of work, monitoring, and control of implementation of the Statistical Programme

The Statistical Programme will be implemented in accordance with the activities that ensure its execution, as outlined under each priority.

The preparation of the Statistical Programme was based on user needs, as well as obligations specified in the Statistical Requirements Compendium 2024 (edition 2024). Therefore, the elaboration of activities and development objectives of the Statistical Programme is structured according to statistical areas, in line with the international classification of statistical activities.

Since the Statistical Programme is prepared in accordance with user needs, it can be modified and supplemented to accommodate subsequent user requests. There is also the possibility of later amendments to the Statistical Programme.

The implementation of the Statistical Programme will be financed through regular budgetary allocations of statistical institutions in Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as through donor assistance via the implementation of various projects in cooperation with international organizations and institutions.

5 PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES FOR THE PERIOD 2025 – 2028

The document *Strategic Directions for the Development of Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina 2030* defines three main directions for the development of official statistics, based on:

- User needs,
- Improvement of statistical business processes, and
- Development of a sustainable institutional environment.

Statistical institutions are required to identify new measurement methods and provide clear and credible interpretation of the results of statistical surveys. The statistical information we produce forms the basis for discussion, research, and analysis, thereby ensuring that decisions can be made based on reliable and objective information at all levels. For these reasons,

special attention will be given to meeting user needs, increasing the accessibility of, and awareness about, the services provided by the Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

5.1 User needs

Since user needs are of utmost importance for the further development of the statistical system, activities must be focused on meeting those needs, which is achieved through close cooperation between users and producers of official statistics, as well as by building a quality relationship with users. This will ensure the availability of data on user characteristics, the intensity/frequency of use of specific statistics, the quality of services provided to users, and their satisfaction with those services. A quality relationship with users is also achieved through their statistical education and by increasing the scope and quality of services made available to them.

To meet the stated user needs in the coming period, special attention will be devoted to:

- Building trust in statistical data by ensuring the timely availability of data, organizing “open days,” as well as workshops and seminars with specific user groups. Increase activities directed specifically towards users, without focusing solely on particular groups.
- Ensuring that users have faster access to the requested data through the use of the website, providing data accessibility through various communication channels, and regularly publishing interesting statistical information on social media and the website.
- Promote official statistics on social media through the visualisation of statistical data and the creation of infographics. Maintain active communication via social media platforms such as Facebook and Twitter, in accordance with the Online Communication Strategy, which prescribes two to three posts per week on each of the mentioned channels. All releases (publications, other documents, news, etc.) as well as special content created primarily for social media (infographics, charts, information) will be promoted through these channels.
- Regularly maintain and enhance communication, cooperation, and coordination among all interested users of our services.
- Workshops and training sessions for different user groups will encourage interest in statistics and help identify gaps or deficiencies in “statistical literacy.”
- Clarify and simplify communication with the media. Clearly define the process of communication with the media, specifying who may give statements and when, the manner and authorization for granting media interviews, the types of information that may or may not be disclosed to the public, and ensure an expedited process for the preparation and approval of media statements.
- Continue with regular media monitoring. Prepare specific (thematic) daily, weekly, and monthly press clippings/reports on media coverage. The media monitoring report, in electronic form, shall be distributed to all interested parties within the institution.
- Increase transparency. It is necessary to make decision-making staff, as well as other staff from different sectors, available to respond to user inquiries.
- Continue providing data upon user requests. Ensure the monitoring of user requests by keeping records on the user, type of request, method of submission, date of receipt,

description of data (type and year), staff members involved in preparing the response, date of response, and the method of response. Enable the submission of requests through the website in the form of an online form.

5.2 Improvement of statistical business processes

The modernization and development of statistical business processes primarily relate to:

- *Modernization and improvement of the processes of collecting, processing, and disseminating statistical data through the use of modern information and communication solutions*

With the aim of modernizing the statistical system, further enhancement in the use of modern information and communication technologies is planned in the coming period.

To achieve this goal, it is necessary to increase the efficiency of conducting statistical surveys, primarily through the introduction of new and the improvement of existing ICT solutions in all phases of the statistical business process - from data collection, production, processing, and dissemination of official statistics followed by the standardization of statistical processes and the mutual exchange and adoption of standards within the system, the establishment of systematic monitoring of resource utilization, and the strengthening of the potential of administrative and other data sources that can replace surveys based on direct data collection.

The allocation of available resources within the statistical system towards the optimisation of statistical processes and innovative activities that modernise and improve these processes, as well as the development of automated techniques based on common standards applicable to a wider range of statistical products, will be carried out through the application of new ICT solutions.

The preparation of an analysis of the existing infrastructure for the process of digitalisation and digital transformation, along with the development of innovative methods and tools and their application in statistical processes, is aimed at increasing the relevance and value of statistical results.

Efforts will be made to increase the visibility of official statistics through the introduction of modern tools in the data dissemination process, as well as to improve the digital skills of employees for the visualisation of official statistics results. Work will also focus on establishing technical communication between statistical institutions and administrative sources through appropriate electronic data exchange systems. Within the Agency, an appropriate electronic document management system (eDMS) will be established.

One of the priority tasks is the implementation of the SDMX standard as a basis for data transmission, reporting, and dissemination. An environment and architecture for SDMX-based dissemination will be established, intended to serve in the future as a central dissemination hub. This will result in the creation of a more advanced and modern online dissemination database, enabling end users to have simple and intuitive access to statistical data, as well as the ability to independently generate tables (with predefined variables) and charts for specific statistical areas.

- *Increase the efficiency of statistical processes by reducing the burden on reporting units and introducing new data sources.*

The burden on reporting units is subject to continuous monitoring and control within the statistical system. The application of appropriate sampling methods and suitable data collection techniques, the introduction of administrative and other data sources into statistical surveys, the linking of data from different sources in the production of official statistics, the establishment and use of statistical registers, and the exchange of statistical data within the system are all activities aimed at reducing the burden on reporting units and increasing the efficiency of the statistical system.

The system for collecting, processing, and publishing statistical data will be based on best practices applied by the most advanced statistical systems and will introduce technological improvements that simplify requirements for reporting units, increase the flexibility of the statistical system, and enable its adaptation to new demands, while ensuring that the burden on reporting units is not increased.

The introduction of new information and communication technologies also enables users to access a broader set of data in a simple and cost-effective manner, while ensuring the development and application of technologies that protect confidential statistical data.

In the coming period, it will be necessary to intensify the process of integrating administrative data sources into statistical production to create the preconditions for establishing a population statistical register in cooperation with relevant institutions in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

5.3 Development of a sustainable institutional environment

The development of the official statistics system is a complex process that requires continuous cooperation with users, producers of official statistics, and reporting units, in accordance with international standards.

The sustainability and development of the official statistics system of Bosnia and Herzegovina are achieved through timely and continuous human resource development via professional training, the establishment of a positive organizational structure, and efficient organization in line with user needs and requirements.

The strengthening and development of a sustainable institutional environment will be ensured through the implementation of the following activities:

- *Aligning the official statistics of BiH with the EU legal framework*

The drafting of the Law on Official Statistics, which will establish the legal framework for the production, dissemination, and development of the official statistics system of Bosnia and Herzegovina, is one of the priority objectives in the coming period.

The Law on Official Statistics establishes and implements the principles of official statistics. These principles are defined to ensure full harmonisation of statistical surveys and other activities, as well as the methodology for producing official statistics results, with international statistical standards, primarily the standards of the European Statistical System (ESS) and the European Union (EU) with the aim of providing impartial and high-quality data

on economic, demographic, social, and other societal phenomena, as well as on environmental issues.

The Law on Official Statistics will ensure the implementation of the fundamental principles of official statistics and provide the basis for adopting the Code of Practice for Official Statistics in BiH. In addition, the law establishes the legal basis for: the organization of the official statistics system, the formation of advisory and coordination bodies, the adoption of a five-year programme and an annual plan, the collection and processing of data for carrying out official statistics activities, the dissemination of official statistics results, and the provision of statistical services.

The Law on Official Statistics will regulate the organization and coordination of the official statistics system of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the authority and management of the Agency for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina, relations with producers of official statistics in Bosnia and Herzegovina, the programming of official statistics activities, the methodological basis of statistical surveys, data collection, processing and storage, dissemination of statistical products, statistical confidentiality and data protection, the quality of official statistics, international cooperation, as well as other matters of importance for official statistics.

- *Strengthening coordination within the statistical system*

Effective coordination and communication among producers of official statistics contribute to the strengthening and improvement of the system and the quality of statistical data itself. Coordination involves harmonising methodologies between producers of official statistics, exchanging data within the system, and aligning positions regarding requests to administrative data sources.

It is necessary to hold monthly coordination meetings of the governing bodies of official statistics producers, organise work within various working groups for specific statistical areas, and continuously monitor the implementation of the European Statistics Code of Practice by the producers of official statistics.

The goal of integrating statistical data is the rational use of resources from various institutions and the reduction of the burden on data providers. The overall objective is to ensure better communication, improve the quality of statistical products, and achieve greater consistency in the data collected, published, or used within the statistical system.

- *Strengthening the statistical system through the development of methodologies and standards*

The development of new methodologies and standards, as well as participation in the development of standards such as SIMS 2.0 (Single Integrated Metadata Structure) for quality reporting, and involvement in the development of economic, social, geographic, and other classifications (NACE, CPA, ISCO) and methodologies at the international level and within the European Statistical System, is a continuous process in the development of official statistics.

The overall methodological framework applied to the development, production, and dissemination of official statistics should follow European and other international standards, guidelines, and best practices, while also being oriented towards innovation, such as experimental statistics, which uses new data sources and methods to better meet user needs.

In the development of methodologies and standards, collaboration with the scientific community is established to improve methodology, increase the efficiency of applied methods, and promote the use of new tools. The development and enhancement of statistical registers, which serve as data sources across various statistical domains, contribute to better integration of administrative and other data sources for statistical purposes.

- *Strengthening professional and human resource capacities within the official statistics system*

The level of expertise of available human resources is a key element affecting the quality of official statistics. An insufficient number of qualified personnel represents a potential risk to the production and sustainability of official statistics.

The sustainability and development of the official statistics system of Bosnia and Herzegovina is achieved through timely and continuous provision and development of human resources via professional training, the establishment of a positive organizational structure, and the efficient organization of the entire official statistics system. This activity aims to strengthen the professional knowledge required for the development and production of high-quality statistics and to provide opportunities for staff professional education through internal workshops and training, the European Statistical Training Programme (ESTP), training organized by the Agency for Civil Service of BiH, as well as participation in study visits within the framework of specific projects, etc.

Through the development of a human resources management and development system, continuous education and the inflow of suitable and qualified personnel with specific knowledge and skills will be ensured, enabling them to meet the challenges posed by globalization and digitalization, so that statistics can maintain their quality and timeliness in data publication (e.g., methodologists, macroeconomists, experts in innovative practices of statistical data collection and processing).

- *Enhancing digital knowledge and skills within the official statistics system.*

The introduction of modern ICT solutions into the system of official statistics collection, processing, and dissemination increases the efficiency of the overall official statistics production system. This activity will also contribute to digital transformation, expand access to digital infrastructure and services, and support the achievement of one of the United Nations 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): *SDG 16 – Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all, and build effective, accountable, and inclusive institutions at all levels*. In the context of modernization, further expansion of the use of advanced information and communication technologies is planned in the upcoming period. To achieve this goal, it is essential to increase the efficiency of conducting statistical surveys by introducing new and improving existing ICT solutions in the implementation of statistical activities: the collection, production, processing, and dissemination of official statistics data.

6 PROGRAM OBJECTIVES BY STATISTICAL DOMAINS

This chapter presents the program objectives for individual statistical domains, along with a brief description of the activities involved. An overview of the expected results is provided in a separate table (Section 8).

6.1 DEMOGRAPHIC AND SOCIAL STATISTICS

To ensure insight into the dynamic changes in society, the direction of development in the field of demographic and social statistics focuses on improving data on the population, the labor market, education, culture, health, income distribution inequalities, poverty, and social protection. Social statistics are continuously enhanced to align with relevant EU regulations on one hand and the needs of users on the other.

6.1.1 Context of Activities and Purpose of Population Statistics Data

Demographic statistical data are essential for studying and defining a wide range of policies, particularly for implementing social and economic measures.

Vital statistics are based on the collection of information related to vital events and include the collection, processing, and dissemination of data on births and deaths, as well as on marriages and divorces.

Internal migration statistics are based on data from the Agency for Identification Documents, Registers, and Data Exchange of Bosnia and Herzegovina (IDDEEA) and cover the collection, processing, and dissemination of data on persons who have moved within the borders of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Through the population, household, and housing census, data are obtained on the number and spatial distribution of the population according to demographic, educational, economic, migratory, and other characteristics, as well as information on households, families, and dwellings.

The updating of the main statistical sampling frame is carried out to obtain a sampling frame that serves as the basis for selecting samples for all surveys conducted on the basis of individuals and households.

The results of statistical surveys in this area provide data for the preparation of population estimates and projections.

The primary purpose of population statistics data is to regularly monitor demographic changes and future demographic challenges, as well as to provide a basis for implementing demographic and migration policies and tracking the effects of these measures. Population statistics serve as an important foundation for social and economic stakeholders in shaping macroeconomic policies and represent a key guide for future social, economic, and demographic development.

Program Objectives of Population Statistics

- Preparatory activities for the next Population, Household, and Housing Census.

- Improvement of coverage and quality of collected data through the use of administrative data sources for statistics on external migration, immigration, asylum, and residence permits.
- Shortening the timeframes for publishing survey results.
- Enhancing data availability to ensure alignment with EU regulations.

6.1.2 Content of Activities and Purpose of Labor Market Statistics Data

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a survey on labor market characteristics conducted on a sample of private households, in accordance with the methodology and principles of the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the methodological recommendations of Eurostat. The purpose of the Labour Force Survey is to provide comparable data and indicators on the labor market on a quarterly and annual basis.

The Survey on Labour Costs (SLC) collects data on the level and structure of labor costs (wages, social contributions, training costs, other costs, minus subsidies), employees who received wages, hours actually worked, and paid hours of work.

The Earnings Structure Survey (ESS) collects data on the structure of gross earnings (gross wages and mandatory deductions from wages), employees, and hours worked.

The monthly survey on employment and wages provides data on the number of employees by gender and activity, average net and gross wages, and paid and actual hours worked. The Annual survey on employment and wages provides data on the number of employees by socio-demographic characteristics and by activity, data on net and gross wages by level of education and gender, as well as information on hours worked.

The primary purpose of labor market statistics data is to support decision-making in the field of labor market policy through employment measures and the implementation of social policy measures.

Program Objectives of Labor Market Statistics

- Further improvements may include increased use of administrative data for the production of labor market statistics.
- Calculation of labor cost indices.
- Enhancement of data collection, processing, and dissemination through the application of modern information and communication technology solutions.
- Shortening the timeframes for publishing survey results.

6.1.3 Content of activities and purpose of education and training statistics data

Data are collected on children in pre-school institutions, pupils in primary and secondary schools, students in higher education institutions, and on employed and engaged staff in institutions at all levels of education.

Data on public and private expenditures in education, by education level, source of funding, type of transaction, and cost category, are collected within the framework of education finance statistics. The International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED) is applied for defining education levels and fields of education.

The Adult Education Survey collects data on adult participation in lifelong learning activities. The purpose of the survey is to gather information on adults' engagement in education and learning. Lifelong learning encompasses participation in formal and non-formal education as well as informal learning.

The primary purpose of education and training statistics data is to support the implementation of educational policy measures, monitor the effects of these measures, and calculate indicators of participation in educational activities and lifelong learning.

Program Objectives of Education and Training Statistics

- Improve the quality of education statistics by enhancing data collection and processing through the use of modern information and communication technology solutions.
- Further improve data completeness in accordance with Commission Regulation 912/2013 and the content of the UOE questionnaire (the joint questionnaire of the UNESCO Institute for Statistics, OECD, and Eurostat).
- Enhance the comparability of data and indicators across all levels and fields of education.
- Improve the timeliness of publishing survey results.

6.1.4 Content of activities and purpose of health statistics data (national health accounts and health care – non-financial health statistics)

Data are collected and aggregated on total health care expenditure by health care functions and sources of funding (HCxHF), total health care expenditure by health care functions and health care providers (HCxHP), and current health care expenditure by health care providers and sources of funding (HPxHF), in accordance with the International Classification for Health Accounts (ICHA). The development of National health accounts for Bosnia and Herzegovina and regular annual reporting both nationally and to Eurostat and the OECD are carried out. Non-financial health statistics involve the aggregation of data on health care resources and health personnel.

The primary purpose of health statistics is to support decision-making in the field of health policy, as well as the implementation and monitoring of health policy measures.

Program Objectives of Health Statistics

- Continue efforts to improve the quality of collected data on total health care expenditure by health care functions and sources of funding (HCxHF), total health care expenditure by health care functions and health care providers (HCxHP), and current health care expenditure by health care providers and sources of funding (HPxHF), in accordance with the International Classification for Health Accounts (ICHA).
- Identify administrative data sources and collect data on the number and types of hospitals, number of hospital beds, health personnel, resources, and diagnostic equipment in hospitals.

6.1.5 Content of Activities and Purpose of Living Standards Statistics Data

The Household Consumption Survey (HCS) is a survey that provides basic data on the characteristics of surveyed households, the level and structure of average annual consumption expenditures, and information on household ownership of durable goods.

The structure of household consumption expenditures is tracked according to the international COICOP classification. Survey data are collected continuously over 12 months, covering the entire calendar year.

The Survey on Income and Living Conditions is a mandatory survey and the primary data source for monitoring income, poverty and social exclusion statistics. This survey is conducted annually.

The main purpose of the statistical data on living standards is to: provide an overview of the level and structure of household consumption expenditures according to different characteristics; provide an overview of income, poverty, social exclusion, material deprivation, socio-economic characteristics of individuals and living conditions; support the development of social policy measures; assist in decision-making in the field of social policy; enable the implementation of social policy measures and monitor social progress, particularly poverty reduction.

Programme objectives of living standards statistics (income and consumption):

- Improve the quality of living standards statistics by enhancing data collection and processing through the use of modern information and communication technologies.
- Regularly submit EU-SILC data and Quality Reports to Eurostat.
- Shorten the time required for publishing survey results.

6.1.6 Content of activities and purpose of social protection statistics

ESSPROS is a harmonised system that serves as an instrument for analysing and comparing social protection financial flows. The objectives of ESSPROS are to provide a comprehensive description of social protection in EU Member States and EU candidate countries, to analyse the funding of social benefits, and to establish a system suitable for international comparability and consistency with other statistics.

Fourteen social protection schemes have been identified, including: Unemployment, Health and Pension Insurance;

Local self-government units of the Republika Srpska; Employer's costs; Social protection of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina, cantons, Republika Srpska, Brčko District; Child protection of Republika Srpska and Brčko District;

Veteran and disability protection of the Federation of BiH, Republika Srpska, and the Solidarity Fund of Republika Srpska. The functions, i.e. risks and needs of social protection are: sickness/health care, disability, old age, survivors, family/children, unemployment, housing and social exclusion not elsewhere classified. ESSPROS consists of the Core System and Modules.

The Core ESSPROS system covers data on social benefits paid and their financing during a given year, through the revenues and expenditures of units responsible for providing social

protection. The Pension Beneficiaries Module presents the total number of pension beneficiaries across three types of pensions: disability, old-age, and survivors' pensions, as well as by sex.

Pension beneficiaries are individuals who receive one or more periodic cash benefits from social protection schemes (double counting is avoided). The data collection for the Net Module aims to obtain information for measuring the impact of the fiscal system on gross expenditure within the social protection system, which enables better comparability between countries.

The Annual Report on beneficiaries, institutions, and forms of social protection collects and aggregates data on beneficiaries of all types, measures, and services of social protection, as well as on social protection institutions and their employees.

The primary purpose of social protection statistics is to support decision-making in the field of social policy, to facilitate the implementation and monitoring of social policy measures, and to provide information on the social impact of fiscal measures.

Programme Objectives of Social Protection Statistics

- Continue to improve the quality of data collected and submitted to Eurostat in accordance with Regulation No. 458/2007 and other relevant regulations (e.g. identification of administrative data sources on non-profit organisations and institutions, improvement of estimates on employer schemes, etc.).
- Continue positive cooperation among national institutions involved in social protection statistics in order to provide Eurostat with high-quality data and metadata.
- Continue to develop/improve the statistical production system to ensure the transmission of ESSPROS data according to the SDMX structure.
- Continue providing early estimates of the main ESSPROS indicators and the corresponding collection of metadata in accordance with the methodology.
- Strengthen cooperation between social protection statistics and national accounts statistics in order to establish a link between ESSPROS and the national accounts.
- Carry out all necessary feasibility studies and preparatory work for the collection of data and metadata on recipients of unemployment benefits in accordance with the methodology defined by Eurostat.
- Continue the compilation and transmission of ESSPROS quality reports.
- Explore possibilities for revising the content of social protection forms on beneficiaries, institutions and types of social protection, as well as the transition to the use of administrative sources.

6.1.7 Content of Activities and Purpose of Crime and Justice Statistics

Collection and aggregation of data on adults and juveniles against whom criminal proceedings and preparatory procedures based on criminal charges have been completed, as well as those for whom criminal proceedings have been concluded with a final judgment. Through the joint questionnaire of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) and Eurostat, data are collected in the area of justice and the criminal system on crime trends and criminal justice operations from the competent judicial and police institutions – UN CTS questionnaire.

The primary purpose of statistical data in crime and justice statistics is to provide a detailed presentation and analysis of certain current forms of crime; to provide presentations and analyses of the decisions of bodies that conduct criminal prosecution and criminal proceedings; to serve as a basis for the adoption of measures of criminal-law policies and for monitoring the effects of those measures; the development of surveys, ensuring reliable indicators on violence and victimisation of the population in relation to certain forms of crime.

Program Goals of Crime and Justice Statistics

- Use of administrative databases for the production of crime statistics.
- Establishment of full cooperation with competent judicial and police institutions for the purpose of collecting and producing crime and penal justice statistics.
- Implementation of the International Classification of Crime for Statistical Purposes (ICCS) for the purposes of the UN Crime Trends Survey questionnaire.
- Development of comprehensive statistics on domestic (family) violence.
- Development of victim-based statistics with the calculation of victimisation rates of the population for various forms of offences.

6.1.8 Content of activities and purpose of cultural statistics data

Collection and aggregation of data on activities by cultural domains: museums, archives, galleries, orchestras, libraries, publishing, festivals, theatres, cultural centres, cultural and artistic associations, heritage protection institutes, film archives, cinematography, and radio and TV stations.

The primary purpose of cultural statistics data is the planning of measures and the allocation of funds based on reliable and high-quality data that will contribute to the development of culture.

Program goals of cultural statistics

- Improvement of the quality of statistical data and the use of administrative databases.
- Use of data from other statistical surveys.
- Monitoring the activities of Eurostat's EG Culture (through EG meetings and the public CIRCABC website) and of the EU/UNESCO cultural framework, as well as participation in the European EGMUS network on data for museums.

6.1.9 Content of activities and purpose of gender statistics data

Gender statistics are an integral part of statistical surveys. In the development of all statistical domains, the gender component is taken into account wherever possible. Data disaggregated by sex are collected from available statistical surveys and administrative sources for the purpose of producing the publication "Women and Men in BiH". The Agency for Gender Equality of Bosnia and Herzegovina within the Ministry for Human Rights and Refugees, together with the Agency for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina, has produced partial gender equality indices for Bosnia and Herzegovina. The index represents a tool that measures the degree of achieved gender equality in the countries of the European Union, as

well as in candidate and potential candidate countries for EU membership. Gender equality is measured on a scale from 0 to 100, where 0 represents complete inequality and 100 complete equality. The index consists of six domains: Work, Money, Knowledge, Time, Power, and Health.

The primary purpose of gender statistics is, through the publication “Women and Men in BiH” and through the Gender Equality Index, to ensure the data needed by the competent legislative and executive authorities at all levels of government in Bosnia and Herzegovina to fulfil their legal obligations and ensure the implementation of international standards in the field of gender equality.

The Gender Equality Index, according to the methodology of the European Institute for Gender Equality (EIGE), is recognised in the EU as an important instrument for analysing the state of gender equality in society, as well as for comparing current trends and the current situation.

Program goals of gender statistics

- Continuous work on improving the content and quality of the publication “Women and Men in BiH”.
- Development of the full Gender Equality Index for BiH.
- Conducting research on gender-based violence against women and other forms of violence according to EU methodology.

6.2 ECONOMIC STATISTICS

The primary objectives in the field of economic statistics relate to macroeconomic and business statistics. In macroeconomic statistics, the main goal is the further harmonisation of the National Accounts System with international standards, that is, the timely and high-quality implementation of the SNA 2008 (System of National Accounts 2008) and ESA 2010 (European System of Accounts 2010) standards. Providing data for monitoring macroeconomic trends requires continuous enhancement of the content of relevant statistics and their mutual harmonisation, particularly in the areas of national accounts (annual, quarterly, regional), as well as government finance statistics and reporting on excessive deficits. It is also necessary to improve cooperation with other producers of official statistics, while adapting and maximising the use of administrative data sources.

The primary objective in business statistics is to provide statistical indicators relevant for the adoption of economic policy measures, monitoring economic development, and comparing it with the economies of other countries, as well as for the adoption of measures and plans of specific policies in the relevant areas.

Activities will continue in the process of further harmonising the National Accounts System with international standards, as well as macroeconomic statistics under the responsibility of the Central Bank of BiH, with the aim of full compliance with the standards and the EU transmission programme.

The Central Bank of BiH will continue cooperation with the Agency and the entity statistical institutes, ministries of finance at the state and entity levels, and other institutions.

Full implementation of the EU transmission programme in terms of data coverage and timeliness of publication will enable the comparison of all macroeconomic indicators with EU member states and other countries.

6.2.1 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of macroeconomic accounts and statistics

The international accounts and balance of payments provide a systematic presentation of the value of economic transactions of BiH residents with non-residents over a specific period (generally a year, quarter, or month). The balance of payments is compiled using statistical surveys conducted by the Central Bank of BiH, administrative data sources, and reports on foreign trade in goods.

Compilation of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by the production approach – current prices; preparation of production accounts (output, intermediate consumption, and value added) in accordance with ESA 2010 methodology. Publication of data at the level of sectors of the BiH Classification of Activities 2010 (NACE Rev.2); regular transmission of data to Eurostat.

Compilation of GDP and its components by the income approach – current prices (compensation of employees, other taxes and subsidies on production, consumption of fixed capital, gross operating surplus, and gross mixed income) in accordance with ESA 2010 recommendations.

Publication of data at the level of sectors of the BiH Classification of Activities 2010 (NACE Rev.2); regular transmission of data to Eurostat.

Estimation of components for the calculation of GDP by the expenditure approach – current prices (household final consumption expenditure; NPISH final consumption expenditure; total government final consumption expenditure; gross fixed capital formation, changes in inventories, net exports of goods and services).

Calculation of GDP by the production approach at constant prices (previous year's prices); primarily using the single indicator output method (applying extrapolation or deflation methods, depending on available indicators) and calculation of chain-linked values at reference year prices.

Publication of data at the level of sectors of the BiH Classification of Activities 2010 (NACE Rev.2); regular transmission of data to EUROSTAT.

Conversion of the components of GDP compiled by the expenditure method into constant prices (previous year's prices), using extrapolation or deflation methods depending on the available indicators. Calculation of the real growth index of individual categories. Publication of data and regular transmission of data to Eurostat.

Calculation and comparison of price levels and volume levels of Gross Domestic Product and its expenditure components between countries participating in the project. This activity is carried out through BiH's participation in the European Comparison Programme, and thus in the International Comparison Programme.

Calculation and publication of data on: actual payments for gross fixed capital formation by main forms of financing; temporal alignment between actual payments and realised

investments; realised investments in fixed assets and in new and used fixed assets by technical structure; disposed fixed assets; actual investments in new fixed assets by purpose and by territory; realised investments by type of construction; and realised investments for environmental protection.

Regular publication of quarterly GDP estimates by the production approach, in current prices, previous year's prices as volume measures, and chain-linked series at 2021 prices; regular transmission of data to Eurostat.

Regular publication of quarterly GDP estimates by the expenditure approach, in current prices, previous year's prices as volume measures, and chain-linked series at 2021 prices; regular transmission of data to Eurostat.

Using available data from the Central Bank of BiH, the calculation of Gross National Income and Gross National Disposable Income for BiH will be carried out.

The primary purpose of statistical data in the field of macroeconomic statistics is to present general indicators of economic activity trends; to serve as a basis for the adoption of economic policy measures and for monitoring the effects of those measures.

Program goals in the field of macroeconomic statistics

- Continuous work on establishing reliable and comparable national accounts (in current and constant prices), with ongoing measurement of progress in the implementation of the SNA 2008/ESA 2010 concepts and methodology.
- Activities for the establishment of annual sectoral accounts in BiH, in accordance with EU requirements.
- Development of methodology for the preparation of sectoral accounts.
- Institutional coordination and communication to ensure the consistency of data from all institutions in the BiH statistical system that collect, publish, or use macroeconomic statistics within their scope of work.
- Development of regional accounts.
- Improvement of the compilation of the current account of the balance of payments in the areas of services, primary income, and secondary income.
- Compilation and dissemination of international trade in services statistics (ITSS) on an annual basis in accordance with the applicable methodology (BPM, EBOPS, MSITS) and Eurostat requirements (Vademecum – International Trade in Services and Remittances).
- Development of the compilation and dissemination of international investment position (IIP) statistics, including reports on other economic flows, in accordance with the applicable methodology (BPM) and Eurostat requirements.
- Implementation of government finance statistics compilation in accordance with the ESA 2010 Methodology.
- Development of financial accounts statistics and transmission in accordance with Eurostat requirements.
- Further development of monetary and other financial sector statistics with the aim of full compliance with financial sector statistics defined by the European Central Bank.
- Improvement of interest rate statistics to achieve full compliance with ECB requirements and development of interest rate statistics on government securities.

- Transition from GDDS (General Data Dissemination Standard) to SDDS (Special Data Dissemination Standard) and SDDS+.

6.2.2 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of business statistics

The Statistical Business Register (SBR) is a complete, extensive, structured, and regularly updated database of administrative and statistical units engaged in the production of goods and services. It includes data on legal and natural persons carrying out any economic activity. Data are obtained from administrative sources, and statistical surveys of business statistics as well as direct contacts with reporting units are used for updates. Data are updated at least once a year. Units registered in the SBR include: legal units, enterprises, local units, enterprise groups, and non-resident units that are ownership-linked to resident units. The SBR provides a framework for conducting statistical surveys, statistical analyses of the business population, compiling business demography statistics, establishing links with administrative data sources, and for identifying and creating statistical units.

Structural Business Statistics (SBS) describe the structure, performance, and output of economic activities, valued at market prices, by observing the units carrying out these activities. They provide information used for the analysis of the structure of business entities by activity, the analysis of factors used in the production process, and the analysis of national and regional development. The purpose of structural business statistics is to monitor the operations of market producers and to provide internationally comparable data in accordance with European regulations and standards for structural business statistics.

PRODCOM statistics provide relevant, up-to-date, reliable, and comparable statistical information on manufactured industrial products in accordance with the EU Business Statistics Regulation (EBS Regulation) No. 2152/2019, the implementing regulations of the EU Council, and the prepared Nomenclature of Industrial Products – NIP/PRODCOM BiH, which is updated according to the current EU PRODCOM list. PRODCOM statistics include data on the value and volume of industrial production for industrial products, which can be linked to foreign trade data at the product level, and enable the comparison of national production with European and other international production at the product level.

Data are published annually for all products together with linked foreign trade data (exports/imports) for the most important products, for which available consumption in BiH is calculated.

Short-term business statistics (STS) provide relevant, up-to-date, reliable, and comparable statistical indicators on the latest developments in various economic areas for the purpose of decision-making in current economic policy in BiH, in accordance with the EU Business Statistics Regulation (EBS Regulation) No. 2152/2019.

STS cover four main economic areas: industry, construction, retail trade, and other services. The areas and activities of STS are defined in accordance with the current Classification of Activities – CA BiH 2010, which is identical to the EU statistical classification of economic activities NACE Rev. 2.

Considering the planned significant changes in the classification of economic activities (EU NACE Rev. 2.1), STS in Bosnia and Herzegovina will be aligned with these changes. Developments in various economic areas are described through a series of STS indicators, such as production, turnover, producer prices, number of employees, gross wages, and other indicators.

Information on short-term economic developments is collected through business surveys, while some indicators use administrative and other available sources. In addition to the constant requirement to provide quickly available, high-quality short-term business indicators, it is necessary to ensure their continuous improvement and alignment with EU standards. In recent years, the main challenge has been the development of short-term data on service activities.

Considering the increased volume of requirements defined by the new EBS Regulation for business statistics, the priority during the observed period will be the development of new STS indicators, alignment of periodicity for existing indicators, improvement of data quality, and reduction of the reporting burden on units through increased use of available administrative data sources in BiH.

Furthermore, a priority is the modernization of the statistical production process through the development of a generic IT solution that will be used for the production of STS indicators in BiH.

Foreign affiliates statistics describe the structure and operations of foreign affiliates. The Agency collects, processes, and publishes data on foreign affiliates, i.e., domestic enterprises under foreign control in BiH (iFATS), while the Central Bank of BiH is responsible for maintaining statistics on the activities of foreign-related entities controlled by institutional units resident in BiH (oFATS).

Foreign direct investment statistics are an integral part of balance of payments and international investment position statistics. Data on foreign direct investments are presented by investment components (equity capital, reinvested earnings, debt instruments), by investor/investment countries, and by resident activities, as well as data on portfolio investments (investments in equity that cannot be classified as direct investments and investments in debt securities).

International trade in services is an integral part of balance of payments statistics, and its compilation is conducted through statistical surveys by the Central Bank of BiH, as well as with the support of field surveys and econometric models (related to travel services).

International trade in goods encompasses the collection, processing, storage, and publication of data on foreign trade in goods transactions, as well as the calculation and publication of unit value indices for imports and exports of BiH based on foreign trade in goods data.

The Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices measures the change in the price level of goods and services that households purchase, use, or pay for over time, and represents a group of European consumer price indices calculated according to a harmonised approach and a specific set of definitions.

Spatial price comparability, the ECP (European Comparison Programme), compares price levels and GDP levels between EU member states and OECD member states. To make such comparisons possible, the GDP of different countries and currencies must be expressed in a common currency in order to obtain a single price level. Eurostat and the OECD ensure comparability through the PPP (purchasing power parity) project. Eurostat is the competent institution for the annual calculation and dissemination of PPPs for 37 European countries.

Statistics on science, technology and innovation include the collection of data on research and development (R&D), government budget allocations for research and development (GBARD), data on human resources in science and technology, and patent statistics, in accordance with the EU Regulation on European Business Statistics (EBS Regulation) No. 2152/2019 and the

implementing provisions of the EU Council. The legislative framework encompasses several sets and compilations of data collection: the collection of R&D data and government budget allocations for R&D (GBARD), the compilation of data on human resources in science and technology, as well as the compilation of patent data. The main methodological guidelines for these surveys are defined in the Frascati and Canberra manuals.

The primary purpose of data in the field of business statistics is the analysis of operations and structural changes within the business population; the preparation of market analyses and business decision-making; a basis for the calculation of gross domestic product and the assessment of key macroeconomic categories; a basis for adopting economic policy measures and monitoring their effects; the adoption and implementation of strategic decisions in the area of specific industrial policies related to industrial production; the preparation of enterprise business plans for placing their production on domestic and international markets; the monitoring and adoption and implementation of short-term decisions in the area of current economic policy related to specific economic areas whose developments are reflected in short-term business indicators; and the formulation and monitoring of the economic and monetary policy of BiH in combination with other economic datasets (such as national accounts); the forecasting of the dynamics of developments in construction activity, future works, and the structure of investments; the undertaking of measures in the field of residential construction and the adoption of decisions on the development of construction entrepreneurship and various housing-related services; the determination of the level and dynamics of newly sold dwellings; general indicators of economic activity in relations with foreign countries; the preparation of macroeconomic models and indicators; the analysis of operations and structural changes of foreign affiliates; the analysis of the volume of economic activity of foreign investments; the compilation of balance of payments positions and the international investment position; a basis for adopting measures for the promotion of foreign investments and monitoring their effects; a general indicator of developments in the exchange of services with foreign countries; enabling state bodies to prepare multilateral and bilateral agreements; ensuring a comparable measure of inflation with EU countries; the international comparability of countries' economic welfare for the transparent allocation of financial resources from structural funds; the adoption of measures in the field of science and technology with an emphasis on investment in research and development, with these data serving as a basis for planning and creating policies and strategies, monitoring their implementation, and for analyses and international comparisons.

Program goals in the field of business statistics

- The production of more detailed structural business statistics.
- The improvement of the methodology for calculating existing monthly and quarterly STS indicators.
- The development and production of new short-term business indicators in the field of construction, trade, and services statistics.
- The development and implementation of a generic IT solution that will be used for the production of STS indicators in BiH, including web-based data collection.
- The implementation of available administrative data sources for the production of STS indicators in BiH.

- Profiling of enterprise groups and the introduction of a statistical unit corresponding to the EU-defined concept of an enterprise.
- Full implementation of the compilation and transmission to Eurostat of the Harmonised Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) in accordance with EU requirements.
- Further harmonisation of science and technology surveys with the EU Regulation on Business Statistics (EBS Regulation) No. 2019/2152.
- Improvement of statistics on science, technology, innovation, and Information and Communication Technologies in line with the goals of the Digital Agenda for the Western Balkans.
- Modernisation of the data collection process through the development and implementation of web-based data collection.

6.3 SECTORAL STATISTICS

The main tasks in the field of sectoral statistics (statistics of agriculture, forestry, fisheries, energy, transport, tourism, science, innovation, and Information and Communication Technology) are harmonisation with EU standards in order to produce high-quality and timely data on the structural characteristics of agricultural production, forestry, energy statistics, transport statistics, science, innovation, and ICT.

6.3.1 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of forestry, agriculture, and fisheries statistics

The field of forestry statistics includes activities related to the collection, dissemination, and transmission of data for basic forestry statistics, economic accounts, and prices in forestry.

The field of agricultural statistics covers crop production statistics; livestock, meat, and egg statistics; milk and dairy product statistics; agricultural structure surveys (through the agricultural census and later through IFS, the Integrated Farm Statistics), as well as agricultural accounts and price statistics.

The field of fisheries statistics includes biological, economic, technical, and production data on fisheries and aquaculture.

The primary purpose of statistical data in the field of forestry, agriculture, and fisheries statistics is to monitor economic activity and report on it to users, as well as to facilitate data exchange with international institutions; the analysis of agricultural policy measures; reporting on the areas and production of major crops, fruit, vegetables, and grapes; reporting on livestock and poultry numbers and livestock production; agricultural structure survey data at the level of agricultural holdings represent fundamental data in agricultural statistics and play a key role in the creation, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of agricultural policy measures; an overview of general indicators of economic activities in fisheries and aquaculture.

Program objectives in the field of forestry, agriculture and fisheries statistics

- Improvement of the coverage and quality of data collection in accordance with the established methodology and deadlines for the collection and dissemination of data for livestock statistics, milk and milk products statistics, and fisheries statistics.
- Improvement of the coverage and quality of data collection in accordance with the established methodology and deadlines for the collection and dissemination of data for the economic accounts for forestry.
- Improvement of the coverage and quality of administrative data in agricultural statistics aimed at reducing the burden on reporting units.
- Full implementation of activities related to the Agricultural Census.
- Further harmonisation of crop production statistics, livestock statistics, milk and dairy products statistics, and fisheries statistics at the level of BiH (methodology and data collection, validation, processing, and dissemination) to ensure continued alignment with EU legislation.
- Improvement of the coverage and quality of data collection in accordance with the established methodology and deadlines for the collection and dissemination of agricultural price statistics.

6.3.2 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of energy statistics

The field of energy statistics includes the collection, processing, and publication of annual and monthly energy statistics for fuels in physical units for primary and secondary energy sources. It also covers electricity and gas price statistics and the preparation of the overall energy balance.

The primary purpose of energy statistics is to support the adoption and implementation of strategic decisions and measures in the field of energy policy in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Program objectives in the field of energy statistics

- Further development of energy statistics and improvement of the quality of energy data in accordance with the applicable EU Energy Statistics Regulation.
- Monitoring and reporting on the quality of data for energy statistics.

6.3.3 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of transport statistics

The field of transport statistics focuses on the collection and dissemination of data on road freight and passenger transport, rail transport, border traffic of passengers and passenger vehicles, air transport, inland waterway transport, data on registered vehicles, and data on traffic accidents.

The primary purpose of data in the field of transport statistics is to support decision-making and the implementation of measures in transport policy and to serve as an indicator of sustainable development.

Program objectives in the field of transport statistics

- Further development of transport statistics in accordance with the requirements of the Transport Framework Strategy of BiH and Eurostat requirements.
- Improvement of data quality through the implementation of available administrative data sources.
- Modernisation of the data collection process using web-based questionnaires.
- Reduction of data publication deadlines.

6.3.4 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of tourism statistics

In accordance with EU legislation, the field of tourism statistics includes domestic tourism statistics (supply statistics), which provide information on tourist accommodation capacities and their occupancy, and national tourism statistics (tourism demand statistics), which provide information on the participation of the population of BiH in tourism and tourist trips.

The primary purpose of data in the field of tourism statistics is to analyse the role and significance of tourism in the economy of BiH; to determine the dynamics of changes in types and categories of tourist accommodation; to analyse the relationship between tourism supply and demand; to examine the role and importance of specific forms of tourism; and to identify the main economic benefits and costs arising from the development of tourism.

Program objectives in the field of tourism statistics

- Modernisation of data collection in the field of tourism statistics through the use of administrative data sources.
- Development of methodology for the production of Tourism Satellite Accounts (TSA).
- Regular implementation of surveys on private and business travel and improvement of data collection frequency in accordance with the practices of EU countries.

6.4 ENVIRONMENT AND MULTI-DOMAIN STATISTICS

The main tasks in the field of environment and multi-domain statistics are the improvement of environmental statistics, environmental accounts, geospatial statistics, and the production and dissemination of sustainable development indicators.

6.4.1 Content of activities and purpose of data in environmental statistics and environmental accounts

Environmental statistics include surveys on waste statistics and water statistics. *Waste statistics* cover the collection of annual data on the quantities of generated, collected, and treated waste by types of waste and locations of generation/collection/treatment. Waste data are presented according to the classification of economic activities and 51 waste categories, including both hazardous and non-hazardous waste.

Waste statistics also include the collection of annual data on the generation and treatment of municipal waste.

Water statistics cover the collection of data for national purposes and for Eurostat. Data are submitted to Eurostat through the OECD/Eurostat Water Questionnaire, based on a gentleman's agreement.

Environmental accounts are covered by Regulation (EU) No. 691/2011 on European environmental economic accounts. They are harmonised with economic statistics and the System of National Accounts, making them suitable for integrated environmental-economic analyses and modelling, such as the calculation of the carbon footprint and climate change indicators.

Monetary environmental accounts cover three modules: Environmental taxes and fees (ETEA), Environmental protection expenditure accounts (EPEA), and the Environmental goods and services sector accounts (EGSS), within which data are collected, processed, analysed, and disseminated.

Physical environmental accounts cover three modules: Air emission accounts (AEA), Material flow accounts (MFA), and Physical energy flow accounts (PEFA), within which data are collected, processed, analysed, and disseminated.

The primary purpose of data in the field of environmental statistics is to serve as a basis for the adoption of environmental measures and the monitoring of their effects; for the preparation of expert analyses and planning of waste management systems; as a basis for measures in the areas of water supply and wastewater management; and as a basis for planning the further development of water supply and public sewerage networks.

The primary purpose of data in the field of environmental accounts is to link the environment and the economy. They provide an integrated framework of statistics and analyses that guide European policies on resource efficiency, sustainable development, and green growth.

Program objectives in the field of environmental statistics and environmental accounts

- Improvement of data collection in the field of water statistics.
- Production of monetary and physical environmental accounts.
- Enhancement of data collection in the field of water statistics.

6.5 CROSS-SECTORAL STATISTICS

6.5.1 Content of activities for monitoring and reporting on sustainable development goals and the purpose of sustainable development indicators

Sustainable development is development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. It achieves a balance between the demands for improving quality of life, ensuring social well-being and peace for

all, and the demands for the preservation of all environmental components as natural assets on which both current and future generations depend. Eurostat has developed a set of EU indicators for sustainable development goals.

The set of indicators consists of approximately 100 indicators and is structured according to the 17 SDGs. For each sustainable development goal, the focus is on aspects that are relevant from the EU perspective. The monitoring report provides a statistical presentation of trends related to the SDGs in the EU over the past five years (“short-term”) and, when sufficient data are available, over the past 15 years (“long-term”).

The set of EU indicators is aligned to some extent with the UN indicators for global monitoring, agreed upon in March 2017 by the UN Statistical Commission. This set of indicators is regularly revised to include indicators from new data sources that become available over time.

Programme objectives in the field of monitoring and reporting on the Sustainable Development Goals and the purpose of Sustainable Development Goal indicators

- Systematic monitoring and reporting on the Sustainable Development Goals.
- Mapping the availability of data and defining the specific requirements necessary for the calculation of Sustainable Development Goal indicators.
- Defining the responsible institutions tasked with producing data within their scope of work for the purpose of calculating individual indicators.
- Development of national and regional SDG indicators.
- Development of indicators related to the SDGs as defined by the European Environment Agency (EEA).
- Development of UNECE environmental indicators related to the SDG.

6.5.2 Content of activities and purpose of data in the field of regional and geospatial statistics

Regional statistical data are published according to the NUTS classification, mainly at NUTS levels 1 and 2. The national classification of statistical regions is a statistical standard applied for the collection, processing, analysis and dissemination of regional statistics data according to the territorial division levels of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Regional statistics are defined within the relevant modules that address the respective subject areas, and for the purposes of regional statistics, data are further disaggregated according to NUTS level 2 and level 3 regions.

Statistics produced according to lower-level NUTS regions include: regional labour market statistics; agricultural statistics; business statistics; environmental statistics; science and technology statistics; tourism statistics; public health statistics; education statistics; demographic and migration statistics and information society statistics.

Program objectives in the field of regional and geospatial statistics

- Preparation of the Classification of Territorial Units for Statistics, harmonised with the Statistical Regions Classification of the European Union (NUTS)
- Participation in Eurostat's Geographic Information System – GISCO
- Further development and data collection for city statistics

6.6 STATISTICAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND METHODOLOGY

6.6.1 Content of activities in the field of standards for metadata and classifications

Activities aimed at improving the system for collecting reference metadata and transmitting them to Eurostat, as well as developing system functionalities for collecting reference metadata that enable the generation of quality reports from the collected data through the SIMS v 2.0 structure for a given statistical domain.

Activities will be expanded to include the collection of structural metadata for selected statistical domains, as well as the harmonisation of code lists for selected statistical domains. Cooperation with the CBBiH in the field of collecting reference metadata will continue. Training will be provided for subject-matter statisticians for the preparation and transmission of data to Eurostat in SDMX format.

Classifications are one of the fundamental tools for the production of statistical data, and continuous work will be carried out on the development and maintenance of classification standards of official statistics and the necessary methodological tools for their correct application and interpretation (explanations, correspondence tables, alphabetical indexes), which is a prerequisite for the comparability of statistical data at the national and international levels.

The activities relate to the further development of the classification framework, which includes the Classification of Economic Activities (KDBiH) and its revision into the new NACE Rev. 2.1; the Classification of Products by Activity (KPPD); and the Classification of Occupations (KZBiH), including the development and maintenance of methodological tools necessary for their use. This also includes the revision of the international classification of economic activities, NACE Rev. 2, into the new NACE Rev. 2.1.

The primary purpose of applying metadata and classification standards is the use of classification standards for the production of statistical data and informing users about the quality of statistical data through the preparation of quality reports based on the SIMS v 2.0 structure for a given statistical domain.

Programme objectives in the area of metadata and classification standards

- Revision of the document Strategy for the Development of the Metadata System in the Statistical System of BiH.

- Harmonisation of KD BiH 2010 with the new international classification of economic activities NACE Rev. 2.1.
- Generation of quality reports from collected data through the SIMS v 2.0 structure for all statistical surveys.

6.6.2 Content of activities in the field of statistical confidentiality and data protection

Activities in the field of statistical confidentiality and access to microdata are focused on ensuring statistical confidentiality, which is one of the fundamental principles of official statistics. Activities within this module relate to improving access to microdata, increasing the availability of confidential statistical data for research purposes, and the development and harmonisation of rules and methods for the protection of macro (tabular) and microdata.

The primary purpose of ensuring statistical confidentiality and data protection is to enable the use of confidential data for scientific research purposes.

Program goals in the field of statistical confidentiality and data protection

- Increase the availability of databases for scientific research purposes.
- Further improve access to microdata through all available channels.
- Enhance institutional coordination and communication within the statistical system in the area of ensuring statistical confidentiality and data protection.

7 ASSESSMENT OF RISK EXPOSURE IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STATISTICAL PROGRAM OF BiH

The assessment of risk exposure is necessary to identify priorities, i.e., the most significant risks that need to be managed. Risk ranking forms the basis for determining priorities and shows the exposure to risks in the implementation of the Statistical Program of BiH 2025–2028. All producers of official statistics will aim for a continuous risk control process through a risk identification system, which contributes to creating an environment that enhances the quality and outcomes of all activities. General risk ranking is carried out based on conclusions drawn during the analysis of the overall control environment, inherent risk, and measurement in terms of impact and probability.
